She also drafted motions to dismiss design defect and fraudulent misrepresentation claims, leading to the dismissal of those claims.

Olivia also has experience preparing for and defending corporate witness depositions, conducting fact witness depositions, managing expert discovery (including preparing defense experts, defending against plaintiff experts, and preparing for an evidentiary hearing pursuant to FRE 702), and overseeing individual case development and case management.

Olivia plays an active role in attorney and firm development activities. She mentors summer associates, participates in attorney recruitment, and is a member of the Women Attorneys of Hollingsworth. She led the firm's partnership with The George Washington University Law School to sponsor the Hollingsworth LLP First-Year Mock Trial Competition.
